
# National Office Scholarships

### Eligibility Requirements


- Must be a high school senior.
- Must have participated in TeamMates for a minimum of 3 years.
- Must be a current mentee regularly meeting with their mentor (some exceptions may be approved by the TeamMates National Office).
- Must utilize the scholarship beginning in the fall of 2025.
- Some scholarships may have additional eligibility requirements (refer to the 2024-2025 Scholarship Packet for full details).
- Note: If the mentee does not apply during their high school senior year, they are allowed to apply later (until the age of 25 even if they are not a current mentee at that time). However, mentees can only apply one time.

Scholarships can be applied to any type of post-secondary education/training program.





### Non-Competitive

#### For College Partner & Donor Scholarships

- Evaluation Criteria:
  - Academics (GPA & Transcript) = 10 points
  - Essays = 80 points
  - Letter of Recommendation = 10 points
- College partners/donors also provide input in the evaluation.
- Tend to be higher value scholarships.

#### For College Partner Scholarships

- Evaluation Criteria:
  - All admissions/scholarship application materials for the college partner must be completed.

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• Indicate on admissions application that you participate in TM.

Guaranteed Non-Competitive Scholarship

#### Notes:

- Non-Competitive Scholarships: College partner will reach out directly to you if you are awarded this scholarship.
- Colleges/universities typically do not stack academic (tuition) scholarships.

# Scholarship Application (CommunityForce)

- Timeframe:
  - Application Opens: Oct 1
  - Application: Deadline: Jan 20
- Application available at:
  - https://teammates.org/teammates-plus/scholarships/
- Create an account:
  - Personal email (not school email)
  - Password
- Save your work:
  - Click the "Save" button at the bottom of the application sections frequently to make sure your work gets saved.
  - You will be able to save your work and come back to work on it later.


# Note for College Partner Scholarships

Each college partner specifies the date by which you must submit their admissions application. Refer to the scholarship packet for details.

### Helpful Tips

- Personal Information:
  - Enter in a personal email (not a school email).
- Eligibility:
  - Indicate which colleges you are interested in attending.
- Academic Information (10 points):
  - Upload a copy of your academic transcript (either unofficial or official transcript is okay).
  - Transcript document should be in Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel, or PDF format
- Financial Information:
  - FAFSA information (it's okay if you are unsure)

### Helpful Tips: Essay Questions

4 questions x 20 points each = 80 points total Word limit per essay: 300 words

1. Consider the school and/or community related activities that you have participated in during high school. Activities may include, but are not limited to: school clubs/organizations, athletics, leadership programs, career-focused programs, community service/volunteering, employment, or other activities.

Describe your experiences from the one or two activities that were most meaningful to you. What did you do/contribute as a participant? What did you learn/gain from participating in these activities?

- 2. Describe in detail a success story you have achieved during high school. Discuss how you persevered through adversity to accomplish this success. What strengths were you able to utilize and develop as part of this success story—provide specific examples. (Note: Your success story can be either school related or non-school related, but it must be something you accomplished while in high school.)
- 3. What are your educational goals and career aspirations? What steps will you take to accomplish these ambitions including the type of education you will need to pursue and what experiences/skills you will need to gain? If you are undecided on your educational goals and/or career aspirations, what steps will you take to determine them?
- 4. How has your experience with the TeamMates Mentoring Program impacted your life and what are your plans to give back in the future?

### Helpful Tips: Essay Questions

- Break the task into smaller pieces.
  - Start early. Tackle a little bit at a time.
- Keep a backup copy.
  - Type your essays in a separate document.
  - Paste it into the application later (make sure it pastes into the application correctly).
- Organize your essay.
  - Read the questions early and take time to gather your thoughts/ideas.
  - Introduction, Body, Conclusion (create an outline if it helps you)

- Share your story.
  - Be thoughtful in your answers.
  - Include important details and specific examples.
- Seek feedback.
  - Share your essays with your mentors and others for feedback.
  - Revise your essays to make them as strong as possible.
- Proofread
  - Check for spelling, grammar, and clarity.
  - Is your essay conveying the message you want to share?

### Helpful Tips

- Applicant Signature
- Request (Letter of Recommendation) (10 points):
  - Ask your mentor or someone who knows you in an academic or professional context (teacher, coach, supervisor, etc.) if they will be your recommender.
  - Give your recommender plenty of time (at least 2 4 weeks) to write a letter for you.
  - Follow the instructions within the application to send the letter of recommendation request to your recommender. You will need your recommender's email.
  - Notify your recommender that they will receive an email from CommunityForce with instructions.
  - Be sure to go back into your application and make sure the letter has been completed. You will only be able to tell if the letter has been completed—you will not be able to view the letter itself. If needed, politely remind your recommender.
  - Send a thank-you note to your recommender.
- Remember: Final Review and Submit






Post-Secondary Mentoring Program
